THE LIGHTING OF THE PASCAL CANDLE

The congregation gathers in the amphitheater for the Lighting of the New Fire. This New Fire represents the victory in Christ of light and life over darkness and death. In the darkness, fire is kindled.

Presider

Dear friends in Christ: On this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life, the Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which, by hearing his Word and celebrating his Sacraments, we share in his victory over death.

Let us pray.

O God, through your Son you have bestowed upon your people the brightness of your light: Sanctify this new fire, and grant that in this Paschal feast we may so burn with heavenly desires, that with pure minds we may attain to the festival of everlasting light; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Paschal candle is then lighted from the newly kindled fire. The people's candles are lighted from the Paschal candle. Then, the Paschal candle and the cantor lead the procession into the church, pausing three times to sing:



The Paschal candle is placed in its stand. The Exsultet is sung, an ancient Christian hymn that has been sung at the Great Vigil since the seventh century. The people remain standing.

The Exsultet

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! O Universe, dance around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the victorious trumpet of Salvation! Rejoice, O earth, in glory, revealing the splendor of your creation, radiant in the brightness of your triumphant King! Christ has conquered! Now his life and glory fill you! Darkness vanishes for ever! Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! The risen Saviour, our Lord of life, shines upon you! Let all God's people sing and shout for joy.



The Cantor continues and congregation responds:

It is right and good that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise you, Father Almighty, the unseen God, through your only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who has saved us by his death paid the price of Adam's sin. And reconciled us once again to you.

Refrain



For this is the Passover feast when Christ the true Lamb of God is slain whose blood consecrated the homes of all the faithful.

Refrain

This is the night when you first saved our ancestors, freeing Israel from her slavery, and leading her safely through the red sea.

Refrain

This is the night when Jesus Christ vanquished hell, broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave.

Refrain

This is the night when all who believe in him are freed from sin, restored to grace and holiness, and share the victory of Christ.

Refrain

This is the night that gave us back what we had lost; beyond our deepest dreams you made even our sin a happy fault.

Refrain

Most blessed of all nights, evil and hatred are put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained, and mourning turned to joy.

Refrain

Night truly blessed when hatred is cast out, peace and justice find a home, and heaven is joined to earth. And all creation reconciled to you.

Refrain

Therefore, heavenly Father, in this our Easter joy accept our sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering. Grant that this Easter candle may make our darkness light.

Refrain

For Christ the morning star has risen in glory. Christ is risen from the dead and his flame of love still burns within us! Christ sheds his peaceful light on the world! Christ lives and reins for ever and ever.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Baptism

Diana, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Diana, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 


The Lord's Prayer

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Liturgical Notes Regarding the Use of Incense

The use of incense is biblical and liturgical. The Lord instructed Moses on how to use incense to mark and keep space sacred. In liturgy, incense is used to symbolize the act of purification and sanctification. We cense people and things that we want to make and keep holy by our prayers. The smoke, as the psalmist reminds us, is a sign of the prayer rising up so the blessings can come down.

The smell and smoke cloud in the room brings to mind the upper room, a city called heaven, and all things that take us to higher ground. It brings to mind solemnity and mystery of communing with God almighty.

When we see incense at liturgy, it reminds us that our prayer rises to God like the smoke from the censer, purifying our worship, and allowing the Holy Spirit to work in us and make us holy.

TAIZÉ SERVICE | THURSDAY, MAY 9 AT 7 PM IN THE CHURCH

Thursday, May 8th, marks Ascension Day in our liturgical calendar. This evening we will have a special worship service in the style of Taizé at 7 PM. Taizé (pronounced: tay-zay) is a prayerful form of worship noted for its simple yet rich and meditative character. The Taizé worship tradition finds its roots in the ecumenical French monastic community of Taizé, founded in 1940. This ecumenical community receives visitors from across the globe of many denominations and seeks to unite all forms of Christianity. The Taizé service is a contemplative worship experience of meditation, reflection, liturgical readings, and music. There is no preaching, and the experience comes alive through the active participation of all assembled by focusing and deepening our faith through the power of prayer.

The heart of the body of music offered at this service often takes the form of ostinato (a simple melody that repeats over and over) and aims to center prayer. Simple in nature, Taizé music is designed to move our prayer from the head to the heart. If you have worshiped at a Sunday evening service at St. John's, you have likely experienced one of these short chants. This service provides time to get away from our busy week and experience the contemplative and quieting power of prayer.

PENTECOST SUNDAY

Sunday, May 19 — All services

The Feast of Pentecost marks 50 days after Easter. It's the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and take the light of Christ with us back out into the world.
