

Dear Parishioners of St. John's,

I am writing on behalf of our 2024 stewardship campaign. As the Stewardship chairperson, I would like to thank you all for your past and future generosity.

This generosity has made St John's a thriving congregation, a beacon in the community, and an organization that can be counted on to help during crisis, both financially and spiritually. With your generosity we are able to support our many ministries, both local and global.

The number of citizens helped through the soup kitchen has increased significantly over the past few years, providing for many in need. The Witness Stones Project has educated many of us within the church and the community about a part of our local history that, until now, was not widely known. We continue to support our ministries abroad, improving the lives of God's children in distant lands.

The pandemic has changed many things in our day-to-day lives. It has caused financial and emotional hardships for many of us. The financial picture at St John's has changed post pandemic as well. The cost of operations has risen, we've seen a decrease in pledges, and our clergy, staff and volunteers are doing more with less, taking on more responsibilities.

At one time the parish had the benefit of additional part-time clergy (Charlotte LaForest and Benjamin Straley). This was once the norm but is no longer the case, as St. John's and many other parishes prioritize the needs of the parishioners and community. The good work that our talented Buildings and Grounds Committee provides would otherwise require outside contractors. Our Liturgical Coordinator, Allison Fresher, volunteers innumerable hours, working alongside staff to plan and implement our vibrant worship life. We are fortunate that we have dedicated volunteer lay staff spending many hours carrying out all kinds of tasks. Without this volunteer support, our staff would be overwhelmed and there would be a significant increase in expenses for outside contractors.

The Stewardship Committee has been working diligently over the past months to provide more information regarding the efforts we support. Rev. Kate and our treasurer, Dave Rogers, are working to provide more budget transparency to keep you informed about the needs of the church.

We do all this as Christians, walking in the light, to help others in need and less fortunate, to serve God and our community.

St. John's has been blessed. Many congregations are struggling to stay viable and solvent. We want our parish to continue to thrive today and for many future generations.

I am asking for your support and your pledge. For the many who have pledged in past years, please consider increasing your pledge this stewardship season as you are able.

Currently, it costs \$10,000 per week to run the church. A combination of inflation and expanding ministries leads the vestry to believe it will cost \$11,700 per week to run the church in 2024.


We Need Your Help To Keep Up With Our Growth

Attendance has increased 12% year-to-date over the year prior and numbers are getting close to where they were before COVID.

Attendance Information

In September 2022, the total Sunday attendance YTD was 4,745 for an average of 125 people each Sunday.

In September 2023, the total Sunday attendance YTD is 5,306 for an average of 140 people each Sunday.

That is a 12% increase year over year reflecting steady growth.
